# 1 THE IMPERIAL TOUR

>Daily Morning Tour



We begin our tour of the Sultanahmet district, the heart of old Istanbul, at **Hagia Sophia**. Built by the Emperor Justinian in the early 6<sup>th</sup> century AD and designed by Anthemius of Tralles and Isidore of Miletus, the church is one of the marvels of world architecture. Converted into a mosque in 1453, it is now a museum. Its massive dome still dominates the skyline of old Istanbul. It is also famed for its mosaics, including glittering portraits of emperors and empresses and a poignant Virgin and Child. Next we visit the **Blue Mosque**\* which takes its name from the exquisite tiles adorning its interior. Built by Sultan Ahmet I in the early 17<sup>th</sup> century and designed by a pupil of Sinan, the greatest of Ottoman architects, it is the only imperial mosque with six minarets. Its courtyard is especially grand. The **Hippodrome**, the stadium of ancient Byzantium, held 100,000 spectators and featured objects from all corners of the empire. Of these, an **Egyptian obelisk** and a bronze sculpture of three entwined serpents from Delphi survive. The **Grand Bazaar** was the commercial heart of the old city and its 4,000 shops are full of treasures including carpets and kilims, silks, jewelry, ceramics, icons, and leather goods. Wandering through the Grand Bazaar, indulge in some shopping, Ottoman style. (Afternoon tour also available on Tuesdays)

## 2 OTTOMAN SPLENDOURS

>Daily Afternoon Tour



We begin at **Topkapı Palace\***, from the 15<sup>th</sup> to the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the principal residence of the Ottoman Sultans. We visit the fabulous **Imperial Treasury** and the **Baghdad Kiosk**. Topkapı Palace is now a museum and has unrivalled collections of jewelry, including the **Spoonmaker's Diamond**, the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest in the world. It also possesses numerous Ottoman court costumes and ceramics, notably including one of the world's finest collections of **Chinese celadon ceramics**, many gifts from other rulers. Interestingly, some of the ceramics have a special glaze that was said to change color in the presence of poison. We also visit the Imperial Armory, displaying centuries of Ottoman weaponry. But perhaps the loveliest feature of Topkapı Palace are its courtyards' ancient trees; it is easy to imagine the sultan strolling here far from the cares of state and empire. Our final stop, **Hagia Eirene, the Church of the Holy Peace**, is one of the few churches in Istanbul that was never converted into a mosque, as it was used as an arsenal until the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Hagia Eirene reputedly stands on the site of a pre-Christian temple and has the distinction of being the first church built in Byzantium as it was converted into the capital of the Eastern Roman Empire. From there, we visit **Gülhane Park**, once a part of the outer gardens of Topkapı Palace, where the Edict of Gülhane, a declaration of rights and liberties that played an essential role in the modernization of the Ottoman Empire. After the proclamation of the Republic, Gülhane Park was for many years home to the Istanbul Zoo.

## 3 MORNING BOSPHORUS CRUISE

>Daily Morning Tour



We begin with a brief visit to the 17<sup>th</sup> century **Spice Bazaar\***, one of Istanbul's most colorful, bustling attractions. Next, we travel the **Golden Horn** on our way to an unforgettable cruise along the **Bosphorus**, the majestic strait that runs through Istanbul, linking Europe and Asia. From our cruise boat, we view the dramatic sights lining the Bosphorus' wooded shores: mosques, a bridge that for a time was the world's longest and **Rumeli Hisar**, a massive fortress built by Mehmet the Conqueror in just three months as he prepared to take Istanbul. Also noteworthy on this tour are the **19<sup>th</sup> century mansions** of the Ottoman elite and the Sultans' fanciful gingerbread **palaces and hunting lodges**.

## 4 AFTERNOON BOSPHORUS CRUISE

>Daily Afternoon Tour



We cruise the **Bosphorus**, and from the deck of our cruise boat, take in the sights and sounds of this legendary waterway, lined with **historic villages**, grandiose waterfront **mansions**, imposing **fortresses**, like **Anadolu Hisar**, and the **Baroque palaces** of the late Ottoman sultans. After our cruise we travel along the breathtaking **Golden Horn** to the **Spice Bazaar\*\***, a thrilling riot of colors, sounds and the smells of exotic spices.

\*On the rare Sundays when the Spice Bazaar is closed, we offer an orientation session.

## 5 ASIA AND BEYLERBEYI PALACE

>Daily Afternoon Tour



We begin by driving across the **Bosphorus Bridge**, for a time the world's longest suspension bridge, and head for the summit of **Çamlica Hill** and its panoramic views of Istanbul, the **Sea of Marmara** and the **Princes' Islands**. Our next stop is the **Grand Çamlica Mosque**, the largest mosque in Turkey, opened in 2019 and was designed by two female architects, Bahar Mizrak and Hayriye Gül Totu. A short drive brings us to the **Palace of Beylerbeyi** on the shore of the Bosphorus. Perhaps the most elegant late Ottoman palace, Beylerbeyi boasts six sumptuously furnished reception halls with Bohemian crystal chandeliers and Sèvres and Chinese vases, including a main salon with an indoor fountain. The sultans' guests at the palace included Empress Eugénie of France, Shah Nasruddin of Persia and Grand Duke Nicholas of Russia. (Every day except Mondays.)

## 6 ISTANBUL BY NIGHT



We visit an **exclusive nightclub** where we will enjoy **authentic Turkish cuisine**, including the delicious array of appetizers known as meze. The Turks are justly proud of their food. They are equally proud of their traditional music, and after dinner **folk musicians** from different regions of Anatolia will perform for us. And of course no night out in Istanbul would be complete without **belly-dancers**. We will be entertained by some of the city's finest.

## 7 PRINCESS ISLANDS

### >Full-Day Tour

There is no better way to escape the bustle of Istanbul for a day than with a visit to the idyllic **Princes' Islands**. Enjoy cool breezes and charming sights along the way to **Büyükdada**, the largest Island in the chain. Famous for their mild climates, lush vegetation, and ornate Ottoman houses, all the islands are unspoiled by traffic. Only electrical vehicles are allowed on Prince's Islands and we will use one to tour the island and its beautiful scenery studded with elegant mansions draped with purple bougainvillea, reminiscent of a more leisured and graceful era. We will enjoy our lunch at the best of one of the many excellent fresh fish restaurants that line the waterfront, gazing across the Asian shore of Istanbul, so close - though it feels worlds away.



## SECRET TREASURES OF ISTANBUL TOUR

### >Daily Afternoon Tour



We start with a visit to **Süleymaniye Mosque**. Dating to the 16th century heyday of the Ottoman Empire, it was designed by Sinan, the greatest Ottoman architect. Next, we visit **Fener** and **Balat** on the shores of the **Golden Horn**, among the oldest neighborhoods of Istanbul, with their colorful cultures of Christianity, Islam, and Judaism. We stop to taste **Traditional Turkish Tea / Coffee** and then see the 5th century AD remains of **Istanbul's City Walls** and the **Iron Church of St Stephen**, also view the **Aya Nikola Greek Orthodox Church** (Sightseeing) the **Patriarchate** (Sightseeing) and **St Hiresdagabet Church** (Sightseeing).



## 8 BURSA

>Full-Day Tour



We travel by ferry to **Yalova**, then by luxury coach to the city of **Bursa\***, which dates back to the 2<sup>nd</sup> century B.C. The first capital of the Ottoman Empire, Bursa is one of the greatest treasure houses of Islamic architecture. We will first visit the **Green Mosque** and the neighbouring **Green Mausoleum**, both world-renowned for their superb tile decorations, as well as the late 14<sup>th</sup> century **Great Mosque** and the **Koza Han**, which for centuries was the center of Bursa's flourishing silk trade. As the capital of Turkey's silk production and importation, Bursa was also the home of the skilled artisans who produced kaftans, pillows, embroidery and other silk products for the Ottoman palaces until the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Afterwards, enjoy a leisurely cable car ride up the slopes of Mount Olympus, in Turkish, Uludağ, or if the cable car is not running, take in the panoramic views from beneath the more than 1,000 year-old plane tree that gives Çnaraltı its name. **Lunch** is at one of Bursa's most highly-regarded traditional Turkish restaurants, the Darüzzıyafe, where we will enjoy the finest authentic Ottoman cuisine in a historic setting, where Sultan Murat the Second once dined. (This tour is available on Mondays, Thursdays & Saturdays. In the event the cable car is closed due to weather conditions, Çnaraltı is substituted for Uludağ.)

## 9 CAPPADOCIA

>Two-Day Tour



On our way to **Cappadocia**, we fly to **Nevşehir** or **Kayseri** and drive to **Üçhisar** in the midst of the Cappadocian heartland, where we will be staying at one of Cappadocia's unique boutique **Cave Hotels**. Cappadocia is a region unlike any other. Its extraordinary landscape is composed of soft volcanic stone that wind and rain have sculpted into fantastic clusters of multicolored spires and pinnacles. What is more, the softness of the stone encouraged the **medieval Christian** inhabitants of the region to carve out of the living rock literally hundreds of churches, monasteries, towns and villages. A trip to Cappadocia is a magical experience you will never forget. On our way to Üçhisar we will stop off at the magnificent 13<sup>th</sup> century **Selçuk caravanserai** known as Ağz›karahan, and at one of the region's famous "underground cities". These go down many storeys into the earth and are among the marvels of medieval engineering. Once in Üçhisar, we will visit the great rock-hewn citadel that looms over the town. On our second day we will visit the open-air museum of the **Göreme Valley**, which contains the region's highest concentration of painted churches. The **frescoes** are among the masterpieces of Byzantine art. A short distance beyond Göreme lie the villages of **Avc›lar** and **Çavuşin**, both of which have many cave-dwellings, and the dramatic **Zelve Valley**.





# 10 **EPHESUS**

>Full-Day Tour



We catch an early flight to the city of **İzmir** on the Aegean coast, then drive south to the antique city of **Ephesus**. This is one of the world's richest and most rewarding archaeological sites with impressive ruins dating from the Classical Greek, Hellenistic, Roman and early Byzantine periods. It is also closely associated with the beginnings of the Christian faith. In addition to being the city to which the **Letters to the Ephesians** were written, **St. John** and **St. Paul** both visited the city, and the **Virgin Mary** herself is said to have spent her last days nearby. Among the highlights of our tour of Ephesus will be the antique theatre, the famed **Library of Celsus**, the brothel, the vast **Basilica of St. John**, the **Mosque of İsa Bey**, the **Temple of Artemis** (one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World) and a group of recently excavated early Byzantine mansions that feature incredibly well-preserved floor mosaics and frescoes. At Ephesus, the past comes to life in a pageantry of architectural and artistic marvels the like of which can be found almost nowhere else in the world. Finally we will make a short pilgrimage to the **House of the Virgin Mary**, which stands high on a mountainside overlooking the Aegean Sea and the Greek island of Samos.



# 11

## GALLIPOLI BATTLEFIELD FULL-DAY TOUR

>Private Tour



Our tour starts with an early departure for **Çanakkale**, scene of the epic First World War amphibious landing. After touring Çanakkale, we cross the **Hellespont** to the battlefields of the **Gallipoli peninsula**, the crucible where the national consciousnesses of Australia and New Zealand were forged in steel and blood. Planned by Winston Churchill, the Gallipoli invasion was the first modern amphibious landing, and one of Turkey's greatest military victories of modern times, but it was won at the cost of enormous losses on both sides, particularly among the heroic **ANZAC** (Australian and New Zealand Army Corps) troops. They landed at what is known as Anzac Cove on April 25, 1915, and fought there eight months in a courageous but doomed struggle. Over 300,000 men from all sides were killed or wounded in the battle's eight furious months, making it one of the bloodiest campaigns in history. In the words of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, Turkish commander at the battle and founder of the modern Republic, "There is no difference between the Johnnies and the Mehments where they lie side by side in this country of ours... Having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well."



## JEWISH HERITAGE

### >Private Tour



be begin our tour of Istanbul's Jewish heritage with a visit to the Galata District of Istanbul and the [Ashkenazi](#) Synagogue. Built in 1900 by Austrian Jews, it is the only active Ashkenazi Synagogue in the city. From there we will take a short walk to the [Neve Shalom](#) Synagogue\*, built by two young Turkish-Jewish architects to meet the demands of the growing Jewish population in the neighborhood in 1930. Afterward, we will visit the Jewish Museum of Turkey, located in the former [Zulfaris](#) Synagogue, constructed by Italian Jews in the 15<sup>th</sup> century, during the Republic of Genoa's rule of the Galata district as a semi-autonomous precinct. Next, we will take a stroll along the breathtaking Golden Horn to the neighborhood of Balat, once the most important Jewish neighborhood in Istanbul, as evidenced by the superb architecture of its Jewish houses and the Ahrida, Istanbul's oldest synagogue. First built in the 1400s, the building has been extensively restored and reflects architectural styles from several periods. It houses an immaculate collection of carved wood furniture, including a pulpit that resembles a boat's prow - possibly a reference to Noah's Ark. For lunch we'll enjoy authentic Turkish cuisine in the charming Bosphorus village of Ortakoy. Lunch will be followed by a leisurely tour of the village which boasts an alluring combination of well-preserved historic wooden houses and charming local boutiques. Ortakoy's Jewish roots will be explored with a visit to the [Etz Ahayim](#) Synagogue, rebuilt in 1941 following a fire, within view of the iconic Bosphorus bridge.

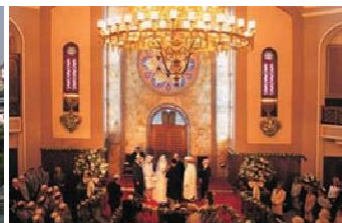


## CHRISTIAN HERITAGE

>Private Tour



The tour begins with a stroll alongside the beautiful **Golden Horn**, the perfect introduction to the splendours of Christendom that crown Istanbul's cityscape. One such splendour is the **The Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople**, once one of the fourteen autocephalous churches within the communion of Orthodox Christianity. Our tour of the Orthodox world will continue with a visit to **Blat** and the **Bulgarian Iron Church**, completed in 1898, brought in from Europe by rail. From here we explore the wooden buildings at the base of the towering ramparts of the Old City, where the practitioners of three distinct religions lived together harmoniously in one single neighbourhood. In addition to admiring the architecture of these wooden treasures, there will be ample opportunities to photograph the Walls of Constantinople, which stand strong to this day, as well as the still standing Golden Gate-the famed entrance to the **Yedikule Fortress**, gateway to the heart of Byzantium. Within those walls, one of the main attractions has always been the Little Hagia Sophia, an Eastern Orthodox church, thus named because it may have served as a model for the Hagia Sophia. After that visit, we will enjoy delicious Turkish cuisine before heading on to the **Galata Tower**, a 14<sup>th</sup> century medieval stone tower built by the Genoese that dominates the skyline of Beyoglu, affording sweeping views of the Old City, Golden Horn, Bosphorus, and the Sea of Marmara from its parapet, as well being one of the most striking landmarks in the city. From the Galata Tower we will take a short walk up historic Istiklal Avenue to the **Saint Antoine Catholic Church**, the most beautiful Catholic church in Istanbul, built in 1912.

## FRANÇAIS

**1 Tour impérial (le matin):** Visite de Sainte-Sophie, de la Mosquée Bleue, de l'hippodrome et du Grand Bazar. (Le lundi Ste Sophie est remplacée par l'église Chora Saint-Sauveur.)

**2 Splendeurs ottomanes (l'après-midi):** Visite du Palais de Topkapi comprenant le Trésor impérial, le Kiosque de Bagdad et l'Arsenal impérial et visite du complexe de la Mosquée de Rüstempaşa. (Tous les jours sauf le mardi.)

**3 Croisière sur le Bosphore le matin:** Visite du chaleureux Bazar aux Epices. Puis, croisière inoubliable sur le Bosphore, majestueux, entre Europe et Asie : les mosquées, l'impressionnant Rumeli Hisari, la forteresse de Fatih le Conquérant. A voir également, les manoirs ottomans du 19ème siècle ainsi que les palaces et pavillons tant convoités.

**4 Croisière sur le Bosphore l'après-midi:** Sur les eaux légendaires, on admire les villages historiques, les manoirs ottomans, les forteresses monumentales comme celle d'Anadolu Hisari et les palaces baroques des derniers sultans ottomans. Puis visite du Bazar aux Epices, ses couleurs, sa musique, son parfum subtil.

**5 Rive asiatique et Palais de Beylerbeyi (l'après-midi):** Traversée du Bosphore, vue panoramique d'Istanbul, des lies des Princes et de la mer de Marmara depuis la colline de Çamlıca. Visite de Beylerbeyi, palais ottoman situé sur les rives du Bosphore (Tous les jours sauf les lundis et jeudis.)

**EXCURSION SPECIALE** Vieille ville journée complète, comprend les tours 1 et 2.

**EXCURSION SPECIALE** Bosphore journée complète, comprend les tours 3 et 5.

**6 Istanbul la nuit:** Sortie dans un Club de nuit privé pour une soirée authentique turque avec dîner et spectacle de musique, danses folkloriques et danseuses du ventre.

**4 Bosphorus-Fahrt Am Nachmittag:** Schiffsfahrt auf dem Bosphorus. Wir erfassen die Sehenswürdigkeiten dieser legendären Wasserstrasse, die von historischen Dörfern, Wohnsitzen, Festungen, wie Anadolu Hisari, und Palästen umgeben ist. Danach besuchen wir den Gewürzbasar.

**5 Asien und der Beylerbeyi-Palast (nachmittags):** Fahrt über die Bosphorusbrücke, Ausflug zum Çamlıca-Hügel, wo sich eine großartige Aussicht über die Prinzeninseln, das Marmara-Meer und Istanbul bietet, Besichtigung des Beylerbeyi-Palastes, der am asiatischen Ufer des Bosphorus gelegenen Sommerresidenz des Sultans. (Täglich außer Mo und Do.)

## ESPAÑOL

**1 Tour Imperial (visita de mañana):** Visita Santa Sofía, la Mezquita Azul, el Hipódromo y el Gran Bazar. (Los lunes, Santa Sofía será reemplazada por la Iglesia de San Salvador en Chora.)

**2 Esplendor Otomano (visita de tarde):** Visita el Palacio de Topkapi, incluyendo el Tesoro Imperial, el Kiosko de Bagdad y la Armería Imperial, y la Mezquita de Rüstempaşa. (Todos los días, excepto martes.)

**3 Crucero Matutino por el Bósforo:** Visita al Bazar de las Especies del siglo 17, una de las atracciones más vividas de Estambul. Luego Crucero por el Bósforo contemplando mezquitas, un puente que por un tiempo era el más largo del mundo, Rumeli Hisari, las mansiones del siglo 19 de la elite otomana, los palacios extravagantes y las logias de caza de los sultanes.

**4 Tarde de Crucero por el Bósforo:** Crucero por el Bósforo contemplando las atracciones y sonidos particulares de este canal bordeado por pueblos históricos, mansiones, fortalezas como Anadolu Hisari y los palacios de los sultanes otomanos. Después visitamos el Bazar de las Especies, una colección de colores, sonidos y los olores vivos de especias exóticas.

\* El Bazar de las Especies cierra los domingos.

**5 Asia y el Palacio de Beylerbeyi (por la tarde):** Pasar por un puente sobre el Bósforo, la Colina de Çamlıca desde donde se pueden ver Las Islas Príncipes, el Mar de Mármara y Estambul, visita El Palacio de Beylerbeyi, un Palacios otomano situado en la costa de Asia. (Todos los días excepto lunes y jueves.)

**1 Escursione imperiale (escursione mattutina):** visita a Santa Sofia, la Moschea Blu, l'antico Ippodromo e il Gran Bazar. (Lunedì la visita a Santa Sofia chiusa per riposo settimanale è sostituita con quella a San Salvatore in Chora.)

**2 Splendori ottomani (escursione pomeridiana):** visita al Palazzo di Topkapi, incluso il Tesoro Imperiale, il Chiosco di Bagdad e il complesso della Moschea di Rustempaşa (Tutti i giorni escluso il martedì.)

**3 Crociera mattutina sul Bosforo:** visita al colorato Mercato delle Spezie\*, indimenticabile crociera lungo il Bosforo per ammirare la fortezza Rumeli Hisari, i palazzi ottomani del 19° secolo, i capanni da caccia e le residenze sfarzose dei Sultani.

**4 Crociera pomeridiana sul Bosforo:** si naviga sul Bosforo e dal ponte della nave si ammirano villaggi storici, maestosi palazzi, imponenti fortezze come Anadolu Hisari e residenze barocche dei sultani ottomani. Visita al Mercato delle Spezie\*, un emozionante insieme di colori, suoni e odori.
